## DID YOU KNOW?

We are working on a printable member directory and want to offer members an opportunity to review their entry and verify if they want to be in the directory before we publish the final version. Visit the "**DRAFT - Printable Member Directory**" page (log in required) to review your entry. Update your member profile to make changes. Please make changes before July 20, when the 2018 directory will be published.

In response to some of concerns about the board's past and recent decisions regarding non-releasable animals, the board has revisited the decision made in February of 2017 and has decided to rescind that decision. We have added back a feature to the CCWR website to post CDFW-approved animals for placement. Once you obtain approval from CDFW, you can submit a [request to add a non-releasable animal to our website](#). Once we confirm that CDFW has approved the animal, [we will post it on the site](#) for up to 6 weeks. At that time CCWR will also post a notification on the members-only Gaggle group email that an approved non-releasable animal may be viewed on the website.

The CCWR Board has also agreed to stay firm on the Facebook and Gaggle decision: we still prohibit solicitations about placement of non-releasable animals on the members-only Gaggle group email or the public CCWR Facebook page. Discussion about husbandry, diet, and enrichment of placed animals is allowed. We feel this is an adequate compromise that allows us to help CDFW in their request to be first contact and still allows a space for non-releasable animals to be viewed.

## Can You Help?

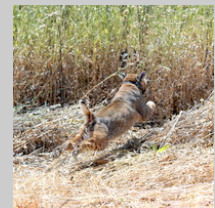
We are looking to add some new features for ENews!!! As you know, ENews is sent out to all members and quite a few others each month. A few ideas are:

This bobcat was released on May 30, 2018 in South San Jose, within yards from where he was found. He spent three months at the Wildlife Center of Silicon Valley, recovering from mange. He also tested positive for rodenticides. If you look closely, the bobcat has a tracking collar and ear tags. The bobcat was and still is part of a study tracking bobcat movement in the area. **Bobcats in Coyote Valley, Part 3**. In this case participation in the study worked to his advantage as the researchers noticed the mange early, before he became severely emaciated. He was quite the vocal one!
